We asked a very flattered Sarah, who was not expecting the overwhelming response to her "true experiences," to recall her inspiring words for this edition of *The Foothills Review*.



I just spoke from my heart. I don't remember every word, but I started by saying what an incredible journey it's been! To stand here in front of all of you is truly a pleasure. I know this isn't exactly a "normal" graduation, but to me, it's better. It's better because everyone here has something to do with how you got here today. It's so much more than a graduation. It's personal. I have never felt more important and loved by a school staff in my 12 years of education. I came from a high school that is described as "the best," and despite the fact that everyone says it's the BEST SCHOOL SYSTEM, I'm standing here in the flesh to tell you, not once in the three years spent at that high school did I feel special, or cared for, or important like I felt at Foothills.
